Brief Comment	<p>Dearest Commission & Interested Parties, I write this comment in full support of adopting a new EAS event code for Missing and Endangered Persons. Specifically, the ability for Tribal nations, let alone the United States as a whole, to properly address the long-overlooked epidemic of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women (now properly encompassing Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls, Relations and People) through a specific code (MEP). In the future after acknowledging this overlooked and endangered population (the very first populace of this land) via the MEP designation, a specific code that Tribally-enrolled members propose, or a body such as the National Congress of American Indians should be proposed and accepted. At this moment the number of missing relatives is too high to permit further time to pass before the FCC takes action. My experience in Indian Country is such: I was the Station and subsequent General Manager of KUYI Hopi Radio for over a decade and continue to work with Tribal nations as an advocate for community radio. It remains the supreme honour of my life to live as a guest on the Hopi Nation as an Anglo and to be of service to those who live in the oldest continuously inhabited settlement of North America. I applaud the efforts of all members of ONAP past, present and future, let alone the multitudes of those working to keep Tribal radio on the air and strong across their original homelands. I hereby submit my support for the Commission to adopt the following through proper Tribal consultation: Amend § 11.31 by: a. Designating the table immediately following paragraph (d) (1) as table 1 to paragraph (d)(1); and b. Designating the table immediately following paragraph (e) as table 2 to paragraph (e); and c. Revising table 2 to paragraph (e); and d. Designating the table immediately following paragraph (f) as table 3 to paragraph (f). Thank you for your time and consideration.</p>
